We are delighted that ORA is part of the new digital Orleton Village Magazine. It is a tremendous initiative. Just so that as many people can hear about our news, we will continue to publish in Grapevine and on our own FB page.

There are a couple of pieces of exciting news from us this month. First, after some 22 years since it was first mooted, the pavilion re-build project has been completed. We are now starting the next phase to finalise it for a grand opening that – as of today – is scheduled to be Sunday December 14th. We will have a couple of trial events before that date to make sure everything works.

We are now sourcing flooring and white goods to install and there is a fair bit of top-coating to

do but we are absolutely delighted with the work that has happened, which has transformed the building and created another really useful community space.

We will also be planting a new hedge to the south of the Rec. Alisha Davidson did a brilliant job of getting the Woodland Trust to donate about 100 metres of hedging, which will include varieties such as hazel, blackthorn, crab apple, elder, dog rose and rowan and we also hope to add some specimen trees to the mix. We are hoping to organise a planting session when we receive the pack.

Report from your County Councillor Dan Hurcomb

The end of the year is certainly coming on fast and life continues at a hectic pace at the moment with lots of local issues coming to the boil at the same time.

Road Works

We have been lucky in recent months to have had resurfacing at the B4362 at Comberton, the Kings Road in Orleton, the B4361 at the Luston turn and the B4362 between Yarpole and Lucton. This has made a huge difference locally and I am pleased to say that in addition to this the B4361 between Portway and Richard's Castle will undergo extensive patching work in November.

Road Safety

This month has also seen the installation of the "20 when lights flash" signs either side of the school. This work and the lining / roundels throughout the village has been paid for from the S106 contribution made by the developers of Captains Meadow. The measures are designed to "calm" traffic and keep local roads safe for all. Thanks go to Cllr Bishop for her persistence in getting this scheme delivered.

Flood Works

On the 17th October 2024, Orleton saw the first flood of the "season" which deposited tonnes of silt in Milbrook Way. The severity of this event and the frequency of events in the months that followed has led to further development of flood resilience schemes and I am pleased to report that we now have three potentially viable options on the table which if delivered together could resolve some of the long standing flooding issues the village faces. There isn't space to list details of all three here but please do get

in touch if you would like to hear more. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Parish Council and Cllr David Lane in particular for their support in getting us this far.

Finance

In less good news, there has been a worrying development with regard to the Council finances in the last month or so. This is as a direct result of the information we are receiving from central government regarding our funding for the next financial year as part of their "Fairer Funding Review". At the moment our current analysis of the financial situation suggests that once the increased demand for services is taken into account the difference between what the council requires and what the council will receive (from Government and Council Tax) is nearly £28million which will rise to over £120m by 28/29 if no action is taken. This pressure relates to the revenue budget but it is clear that the task that faces all of us is tough and significant and painful decisions lie ahead. I will of course keep you updated as and when more information on what this means becomes available.

At the October Council meeting took I was pleased to support three motions at which called for:

1. The Police to reconsider their decision to stop local Police Community Support Officers working after 8pm
2. To promote a "child friendly" Herefordshire, and
3. To investigate cheaper travel for 16-19 year olds on Herefordshire buses.

ORLETON AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB



Propagation: From Seeds, Cuttings and Division

On September 30th we welcomed back Philip Aubury, former Director of Birmingham Botanic Garden, to give a practical demonstration.

Seeds Philip advises looking out for F1 hybrids and seeds which have been awarded the RHS Award of Garden Merit (AGM). Using a fine compost the tray is filled and tapped down firmly. Half an inch of compost is sieved on top. Fine seeds, for example foxglove and begonia are surface sown, medium sized seeds like lettuce are covered with a light sprinkling of compost which he prefers to vermiculite. Large seeds are sown in 3 inch pots, six peas or two beans per pot. Containers are gently watered from above and placed in a propagator. After the first pair of true leaves develops seedlings are pricked out into cell trays, handling them by the seed leaves to avoid damage. They are planted so that the seed leaves rest on the compost surface.

Cuttings Philip uses a mix of $\frac{3}{4}$ multipurpose compost and $\frac{1}{4}$ sharp sand. Demonstrating with pelargoniums, tip cuttings are detached just below a node (nodal cuttings), stripped of all but two or three leaves and dipped into rooting powder before being inserted around the edge of a small pot. They are watered and covered to reduce transpiration. Internodal cuttings, cut midway between two nodes, work better for fuchsias, clematis and hydrangeas.

Begonias and African violets are propagated by leaf cuttings. A begonia leaf is detached cleanly, the veins on the underside are cut through and the leaf is laid flat in a seed tray of compost topped with horticultural grit and weighed down lightly.

Plantlets will develop from the cut veins. African violets are propagated by detaching a leaf cleanly from the base with one inch of stem, dipped in rooting powder and inserted into pots.

Hardwood cuttings, usually taken in autumn, useful for many shrubs including Salix, Cornus and roses are taken by selecting 12 inch long pencil thick stems cut below a node and inserted into tall narrow pots and left in a sheltered position outside

Division Useful for many herbaceous perennials. Philip advises dividing perennials grown on heavy soils in Spring and those on light soil in Autumn.

Like the best television chefs Philip brought 'dishes' prepared earlier to whet our appetites and inspire us, an economical way to increase stock for our gardens and our annual Plant Sale.

Mortimer Practice Patient Participation Group

The Total Triage System has gone live from 1st October 2025

A Total Triage system is a patient pathway, where all patient requests for appointments or advice are reviewed and triaged by clinical staff before an appointment is assigned. This process uses a combination of digital and traditional methods to gather information, ensuring patients receive the most appropriate care - whether that's self-care advice, a telephone consultation, a face-to-face appointment, or a referral to another service - and reducing pressure on phone lines.

How it works:

Information Gathering:

Patients submit their requests using digital forms, online systems, or by speaking to a receptionist.

Clinical Review:

A clinician reviews the submitted information to determine the best course of action.

Appropriate Pathway:

Based on the review, the patient is directed to the most suitable service, which could include:

- Self-care advice
 - A telephone or video consultation
 - A face-to-face appointment with a GP or other healthcare professional
- A referral to another service, such as a pharmacy or specialist

Benefits:

Improved Access:

It aims to reduce waiting times for those who need to call the practice by encouraging more patients to use the digital route.

Better Quality of Care:

Patients receive timely advice and access to the most appropriate care for their specific needs.

Efficiency:

The system helps practices manage patient requests more effectively, freeing up time for staff to assist those who need more help or prefer to call.

Reduced Footfall:

It helps reduce unnecessary visits to GP practices, which is particularly important for protecting both patients and staff from infections.

In essence:

Total Triage is a system designed to get patients the right help at the right time, using digital tools to streamline the process and ensure safe, effective care. Patients without digital access are asked to contact reception either by phone or in person at the surgery, and the team will complete the request on their behalf. The Practice is also installing iPads in each surgery so that patients can come in and use them if they prefer, with staff on hand to provide support.

Orleton Good Neighbour Scheme

The Good Neighbour Scheme supports our community using a team of volunteers to help people who are experiencing difficulty in their own homes essentially, by just doing things that good neighbours do for each other.

Examples of how the scheme can help:

- Fetching prescriptions
- Occasional lifts to the surgery or hospital
- Shopping and running errands, such as posting a letter.




